Notice on Club Annual Reports

Clubs that have filed all 12 of their monthly reports online through the Kiwanis One web site should not complete the Annual Club Report. They have completed their requirements for the 2008-09 year. These clubs will have an opportunity to review a compilation of the submitted data in the first week of November and may modify any of the 2008-09 monthly reports if needed.

Clubs that have not undertaken this monthly reporting are asked to complete an Annual Club Report via the Kiwanis One web site. The Annual Club Report is an online form that allows clubs to report service and administrative activities for the 2008-09 year.

The online report can be accessed online. These clubs will be able to access the online Annual Club Report, starting October 9.

Clubs are asked to complete this on or before November 15, 2009.

In the event that a club secretary is unable to access the internet, two options exist. First, encourage the club to locate another Kiwanis member in the club or division who can assist; using the online form will expedite the club's reporting. Second, a paper copy can be printed from an electronic version available from Kiwanis International's Member Service Center. A mailed paper form will delay the reporting process.
